**June 20: Ollie Howe** is a longtime member of All Souls, a father—and now grandfather—who has shared his Father's Day thoughts several times from our pulpit. He returns with some more perspectives under the title "What Will We Leave Behind?" Ollie's father was the first Eagle Scout of the Old Colony Boy Scout Council, and always told Ollie to leave a camp better than he found it. Ollie says that, although he never made it in scouting past a few merit badges, that lesson remains in his memory as a worthy goal in life. This Father's Day, he'll suggest taking a look at what you'd like to leave behind, both grandiose and personal. What dream can you achieve? What seed can you plant? What example can you set for future generations?

**June 27: Rev. Loring Prosser** is well known to All Souls, most recently for his much-appreciated work during the sabbatical period. Loring will give a talk entitled "Between the Mud and the Stars: The Courage to Affirm," and the plans for his appearance are rumored to include a musical number or two with the children of the congregation.

Bosma is a 501(c)(3) not-for-profit agency dedicated to empowering people who are blind or visually impaired by creating opportunities that lead to the achievement of each individual's employment, economic, social and self-determination goals. Heather is responsible for all aspects of Bosma's fundraising, including individual gifts, corporate sponsorships, foundation and government grants, and online giving.

**July 18: Rev. Forrest Gilmore** is certainly no stranger to All Souls members by now, after his wonderful work as our service coordinator and a frequent speaker this past spring. We are pleased to be able to have Forrest back for an encore, as he shares more of his knowledge and insight with us.

**July 25: Rev. Dr. Laurel Clark** is President of the School of Metaphysics, as well as a counselor, an ordained minister in the Interfaith Church of Metaphysics, a teacher, and an author. She will help us continue our celebration of the Year of Renewal by speaking about the "Day Out of Time," which occurs on July 25 in Mayan astrology. The Mayan Calendar is based on moon cycles, with thirteen months of 28 days each. The year begins on July 26 and ends on July 24; thus July 25 is a special day that comes between the years.
